

Dr Beryl LIN – NSW



Dr Lin is a Resident Medical Officer at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Sydney and a Clinical Associate Lecturer at University of Sydney.

Dr Lin has been involved in creating the 'Clinical Management' tutorials for final year medical students to provide targeted teaching on practical approaches to common ward calls/afterhours/night scenarios in preparation for 'real life hospital life'. This program was successfully piloted in 2019 and received very positive feedback from previous final year students. It is now integrated into the 2020 curriculum and Beryl is collecting data to write up results as a manuscript.

Dr Lin has been a surveyor for HETI for hospital accreditation surveys, and is a JMO representative on the HETI Prevocational Accreditation Committee.

She is the coordinator for a pathology quality improvement/educational project in the Sydney Local Health District for JMOs which aims to reduce and rationalise inpatient pathology testing to improve patient outcomes. The project is being rolled out across Royal Prince Alfred and Balmain Hospitals. Beryl has acquired funding to sustain and expand this project, and a manuscript is in progress.

Beryl is a volunteer for the CSIRO education and outreach program as a STEM ambassador to assist teachers mentor students interested in careers in medicine.

Beryl has attended and supported Maari Ma Health, an Aboriginal community controlled health service in far west New South Wales, in endocrinology to improve health outcomes and access to diabetes care.
