Introductory Comments

- Focus on the prevocational phase those not in vocational training – (latter covered by Colleges)
- Need to include this large cohort estimated to be well in excess of 10,000 - interns and others not in specialist training
- Different needs and concerns of this sector compared to those already in a vocational training pathway



Introductory Comments...2

- CPMEC sees the NTS as part of the process of continuous improvement of the quality of postgraduate education and training in Australia
 - Accreditation by PMCs of health services
 - Review of PMCs by the AMC
 - External reviews of PMCs
 - Part of building on work to date including trainee surveys



Introductory Comments ...3

- Provide better data to inform improvements:
 - Career path blockages in the medical training continuum; support and supervision; bullying and undermining; patient safety concerns etc.
- Needs to be seen as driver or catalyst for changes and improvements to ensure sustainability in long term— access to data for supervisors/employers of prevocational cohort/Colleges as downstream recipients/training departments



Introductory Comments ...4

Governance issues

- Independence of the survey and not seen as being captured by particular interests
- balancing confidentiality with transparency
- timely results and feedback
- professional inputs and stakeholder buy-in critical
- encouraging high response rate (UK 2016 survey at 98.7%!)
- Reiterate CPMEC's support for the process
